About the Workshop

Government programs designed to benefit the public as a whole often result in acquisition of private property and, sometimes, in the displacement of people from their residences, businesses or farms. To provide uniform and equitable treatment for those whose property is acquired for public use, Congress passed a law commonly referred to as the Uniform Act. This act is the foundation for the information covered in this workshop.

This workshop will examine the Federal real estate requirements on projects receiving Federal-aid funds and will explore the basic concepts used in the right-of-way process. The discussion will include how to retain Federal participation on your project by complying with the Uniform Act and 23 CFR 710 Real Estate Requirements. This workshop will include both group and individual activities and will conclude with a knowledge evaluation.
